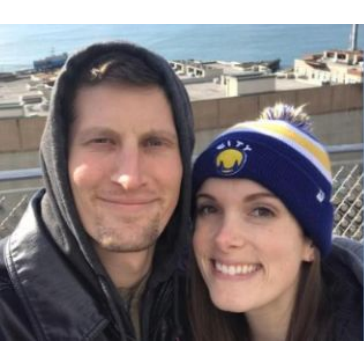

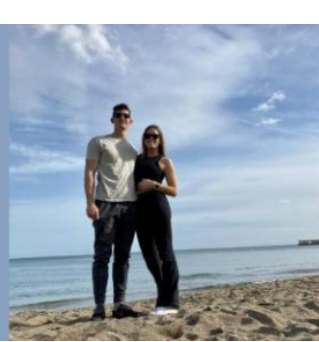
Ian and Karcie

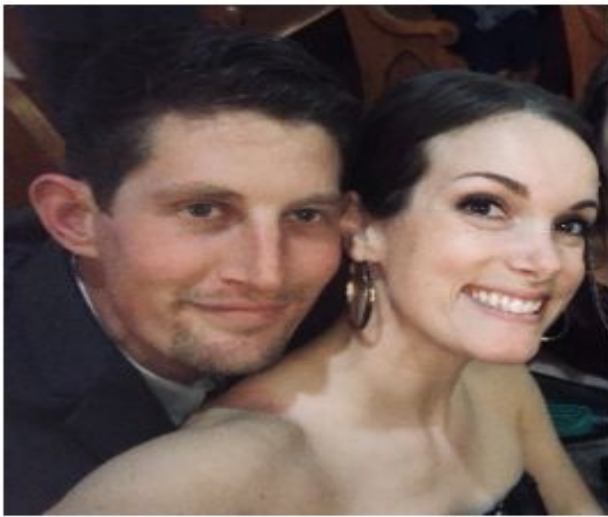

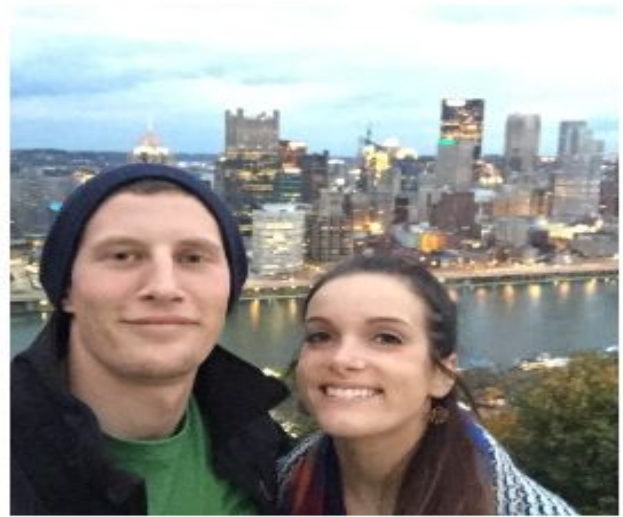

Both Nola and Keen are African-American and being raised by two Caucasian parents. We do not take this responsibility lightly. Being a transracial family adds a layer of complexity to an adoptive family and we will never stop working to improve how we parent and teach our children to prepare them in this world.

We have met some amazing people through college, work, church, and the Air Force. They have taught us about their upbringing and how their culture differs from our own. Whether Filipino, African American, Asian, or Hispanic, each friend has opened our eyes to their heritage, background, traditions, and so much more. One of our main goals of parents is to raise children that embrace their unique qualities and to be proud of who they are both inside and out.

Why adoption?

We've had a unique journey to becoming parents. Adoption was always something Karcie was interested in and shared this with Ian early on in the relationship. It wasn't until after Nola's adoption that we pursued answers related to some health concerns Karcie was experiencing and discovered she had both PCOS and Endometriosis. We weren't necessarily surprised by this news, so we took some time to process it, and moved on.

We knew we wanted a sibling for Noli but then faced the reality of how to go about that. We honestly felt that if conception was meant to be, it would be. We then pursued a second home study and matched with Keen's birth mom the day after we finished the nursery!

Adoption is so beautiful to us: Two families coming together, both from unique situations, with a common goal, a loving desire for the child's future.



2018

In March of 2018, our daughter, Nola Day, made her appearance into this world and was placed in our arms. We truly had an amazing adoption experience and have learned so much along the way. We have a semi-open adoption with Nola's birth mother, communicating every so often, when she feels comfortable doing so. We hope that someday this relationship will grow, but understand that every situation is unique.



2020

In September of 2020, we were matched with an expecting mother who delivered a sweet little boy at just 28 weeks. Weighing in at a whopping 2 pounds, Keen had a lot of work ahead of him before he could come home. After months in the NICU, we finally got to bring little brother home. Nearly three years later, our little guy is not so little anymore and is such a blast to be around. We have an open adoption with Keen's birth mother, who has become a part of our family.
